# Catalytic Converter Theft



Catalytic converters in cars contain precious metals such as rhodium, platinum and palladium. These metals are currently more valuable than gold and catalytic converters sell for more than £500 on the black market. As a result, this makes catalytic converters an attractive target for criminals.

#### How can you deter thieves?

- Avoid parking half on the pavement and half on the road
- Park your vehicle in a locked garage where possible
- Try and park in busy, well lit areas

## What to do if your catalytic converter is stolen

- Do not drive your car
- Contact your local police station ASAP. It is illegal to drive without a catalytic converter

# Safer Communities

#### What impact do we have?

From April 2021-January 2022, we passed on 1,131 reports anonymously to Gloucestershire police, which is 18% up on the previous year's reports. These reports came in via the below methods:

- 158 phone calls, which is down by 20% on the previous year
- 720 online forms which is an increase of 26% on the previous year
- 253 two-way communications, which is a 35% increase on the previous year

Gloucestershire police have reported 94.3% of the reports they received from Crimestoppers were actionable, which resulted in 99 positive outcomes and 35 arrests and charges being made in Gloucestershire.

## 'Stop thieves from stealing our community'

As the evenings start to get lighter, we need to protect ourselves and our possessions from crime. The pandemic has brought neighbours and communities together and we don't want that to stop - help protect your neighbours by looking out for each other's homes when they are away. In order to protect your own property whilst you are away, ask a neighbour to keep an eye out and put your lights on a timer. Try not to leave evidence that you are away for an extended period of time, for example, ask a trusted neighbour to move your bins in after collection day.
