How can we help you

The Independent Sexual Violence Advisor (ISVA) Service provides confidential, independent support to individuals who have experienced recent or historic sexual abuse or sexual violence and have reported the incident to the police.

- The ISVA Service is independent from the police and other agencies.
- It offers one-to-one practical and emotional support, but it is not a counselling service.

Your ISVA will liaise on your behalf with agencies across the criminal justice system and the wider community to develop a tailored support plan based on your individual needs and circumstances. This may include signposting or referring you to services within First Light, Barnardo's, or other community organisations.

We also support individuals who have not reported an incident but are considering their options. Our ISVAs will talk through your choices and help you understand how they may apply to your situation.

Support is available for all survivors, including those who have experienced non-contact sexual offences such as online abuse, indecent exposure, or voyeurism.

Whatever your experience, our ISVAs are here to listen, support, and guide you.

Our ISVA service is open to everyone.

We are a partnership between First Light and Barnardo's, working together to ensure that anyone affected by sexual abuse or violence can access the support they need.

What should I expect?

Referral to the ISVA Service

You will be contacted by our team within 48 hours of receipt of your referral (excluding weekends and bank holidays). They will explain more about the ISVA service and confirm your details over the phone.

Support Coordinators

The Support Coordinators will check in with you every 6 to 8 weeks, or less frequently if that's your preference, through an agreed communication method (Text, Email, Telephone or WhatsApp). The Support Coordinators are here for you when you need them, you can contact them Monday – Friday, between 09.00 -17.00.

Dedicated ISVA

You'll be assigned a dedicated ISVA when one is available in your area. They will provide continued support, with the option for face-face support, throughout the criminal justice process and accompany you to court if needed.

Trauma Stabilisation Programme.

The Trauma Stabilisation Programme offers optional sessions via telephone with our Support Coordinators to discuss onward referrals, emotional support as well as coping and grounding techniques.

Options Meeting

If you have not reported the incident to the Police, you will be offered Options meetings to understand the support that is available to you, as well as support reporting the incident via anonymous information or Police routes.

If you do not wish to report, this does not exclude you from accessing other services such as receiving the self-care booklet, and access into our Trauma Stabilisation programme.

Duty Calls

We also offer ad-hoc calls with a Duty ISVA to answer any questions you may have, and offer support with interviews with the police if you are not yet allocated to an ISVA.
