What do Schoolbeat Officers Do?

- Each manage delivery of the Schoolbeat programme across an average of 60 schools per area
- Design and develop restorative lessons in 14 subject topics focused on police priorities
- Deliver classroom based sessions to each student three times per year
- Build trusting relationships with 10 – 14 year olds in schools



On board with young minds

Why?

- To reduce the risk of young people becoming victims or offenders of crime and ASB
- To raise awareness of risks and threats to the safety of young people – on and off line
- To empower students to make positive decisions and provide them with a problem solving 'tool box' for when life gets bumpy
- To support schools with safeguarding, reduce pupil exclusions and provide advice on day to day police related issues

Curriculum

Schoolbeat Officers offer the following lessons:

- **Year 6** – Internet Safety, Online Relationships, Drugs&Peer Influence, Role of the Police
- **Year 7** – Grooming, Drugs&Alcohol
- **Year 8** – Sexting, Exploitation
- **Year 9** – Domestic Abuse, County Lines

There are optional lessons for years 7-9 of Hate Crime, Bullying, Anti-Social Behaviour and Stop and Search.

Over time more lessons will be created depending on what other topics may be required.
