Advice

- It is not a competition to see who has the most followers online.
- Someone you don't know in real life is a stranger. Would you want to share the photos and videos you put on social media with a stranger?
- Remove 'followers', 'contacts' or 'friends' from your social media that you do not know in real life.
- Remember you don't always know who you are talking to online
- Never ever meet someone you have only ever met online.
- If you are not sure how to remove followers or check privacy settings, ask a trusted adult.

- If you live stream make sure a parent is present and you have the right privacy settings.

Privacy settings

- If you are on social media make sure your account settings are on private.
- Turn location services off, you do not need to share your current location on line.
- Make passwords strong 3 random words,
- Usernames again think random, do not include information about you.
